Can you believe that we will be starting school in just a few weeks? We hope you have had a restful and pleasant summer and are looking forward to the new school year. Get out and enjoy the rest of this summer, but don't forget that summer reading!

Students and parents, as you think about school shopping please carefully re-read CMCA's dress code policies outlined in the handbook. In particular, remember that modesty, moderation, safety, and balance are what we use to outline these standards (not the newest fads or fashions). If you question whether an item is appropriate, it is best to wait and ask before purchasing it. Please note the appropriate hair length for boys is above the collar and that unnatural hair coloring is not acceptable for any student.

Below is a list of school supplies that students will need to bring to school on the first day:

- Bible (the version you prefer)
- paperback dictionary, preferably Webster's
- small daily planner for writing homework and assignments
- pencils, sharpener, and erasers
- 1 red colored pen, and 2 blue or black erasable pens
- washable thin and thick colored markers (small boxes)
- small box of colored pencils and crayons (24 count or less)
- black permanent markers for art class (1 thin and 1 thick)
- multi-colored construction paper (1 pkg.)
- scissors
- 12 inch ruler (which also shows centimeters)
- protractor and compass
- an inexpensive calculator for occasional use with math curriculum (pocket-size)
- 1 white glue stick, and 1 small bottle of liquid glue (Elmer's or similar brand), scotch tape
- 5 single subject notebooks, 5 pocket folders to hold work packets/handouts for different subjects, and a folder in which to send home work, newsletters, and notices
- 1 large box of tissues (we will open one box at a time for class use)
- A book for independent reading (must demonstrate appropriate Christian values and be at or above grade level)
- 2 pkg. notecards
- Plastic crate to store books in that don't fit into desk

Please help students organize supplies (labeled with their name) in 1 or 2 small containers that will fit inside a traditional desk. Also, be reminded that student backpacks are not allowed in the classroom. Thank you for helping students to come well-prepared for this school year.

We welcome our new third and fourth grade classroom head teacher, Mrs. Landis Bornaes. We look forward to seeing everyone and hope that parents will drop by during the first week of school to say hello. We also ask for your prayers as we prepare for this new school year.
